

Moreover, very soon the great Huhudi Hall, where the name Ruth Mompati used to reverberate, will be broken down and rebuild, this ,I am certain will happen, before the tenth anniversary of her demise!

DOORNPLAAT PRIMARY SHUTS ITS DOORS

RYBURG - Doornplaat Primary School will officially close its doors definitely at the end of this year, after five good decades. The school is located in Zitland on the Doornplaat farm, approximately 17 kilometres from the town of Schweizer Reneke, in the local municipality of MAMUSA.

The school, one of the oldest in MAMUSA, recently celebrated its 50th anniversary with its existing staff. It was established in 1972 by the Medupi sisters, Shai and Totos. At that time, it was under the name Naledi Bantu Primary School, with just over 50 learners in two classrooms under the guidance of only two teachers, including the Principal, Shai Medupi.

Over the years, Naledi Bantu Primary School was renamed Doornplaat Middle School under the leadership of Mr Morule. Former principals of the school include Mr Masosi Motlashuping, Mr C.W. Phoko and Mr Happy Maseng. The current principal is Mrs Setshego Martha Moreki, who took over the reins in 2016 from Mr Maseng.

Talking to MORONGWA, Principal Moreki confirmed the school impeding shut down. Ms Moreki lamented that the school, mostly catered for learners from nearby farms including Doornfontein farm,

Panfontein farm and Makouwskop, and had started losing learners when farms closed down and families had to relocate to the nearby township of Ipelegeng.

"The school now has 70 learners, 6 teachers including the principal and 2 support staff. It has 5 classrooms for Grades R to 7", said

When going to print, MORONGWA's efforts to get an official word from the North West Department of Education were unsuccessful, as the spokesperson had not responded to our texts. However, we have a letter dated back to October 2022 wherein the then MEC Maphefo Matsemela formally informed the school governing body and the principal about her intentions to close the school. In the letter, the department highlighted low learner enrolment as one of the contributing factors to the closure of the institution. Matsemela also added that the school would be merged with Tshwaraganelo Primary School in Ipelegeng township.

The 15th of December 2022 will seemingly be a significant day for the books, as Doornplaat Primary School educators and learners will be meeting for the very last time in those surroundings.



WORLD AIDS DAY MESSAGE BY THE NORTH WEST PREMIER, KAOBITSA BUSHY MAAPE

THEME: "Equalise and Integrate to end AIDS"



North West Premier, Kaobitsa Bushy Maape

022 marks the 34th Commemoration on World Aids Day. In the last three decades we have lost our loved ones due to this pandemic. This commemoration present us with yet another opportunity to unite in the fight against HIV-AIDS but critically to show support and sympathy to people living with it.

- The theme for the 2022 commemoration; "Equalise and Integrate to end AIDS" is a clarion call on world leaders and all of us to work in unison to end inequalities
 - · Lifting up the availability, quality and suitability of services, for HIV treatment, testing and prevention, so that everyone is well-served.
 - · Reforming laws, policies and practices to tackle the stigma and exclusion faced by people living with HIV and by key and marginalised populations, so that everyone is shown respect and is welcomed.
 - Ensuring the sharing of technology to enable equal access to the best HIV

science, between communities and between the Global South and North.

 This will enable communities to make use of and adapt the "Equalise" message to highlight the particular inequalities they face and to press for the actions needed to address them.

These objectives are given credence by the United Nations Global AIDS Strategy which is aimed at addressing challenges of poverty and inequalities as these continue to hamper progress in the fight against HIV-AIDS. Poverty has been singled out as the most dominant driver of the AIDS pandemic. Lack of access to health care as well as gender and racial inequalities have been cited as impediments in the fight against HIV & AIDS.

In 2015 our country joined the international commitment to reach the 90-90-90 targets by the end of 2020 as a response to eliminate HIV and AIDS. To this end, the HIV cascades are now monitored through the 95-95-95 targets as at June 2022. This new set of ambitious targets calls for 95 % of all people living with HIV to know their status, 95 % of all people with diagnosed infection to receive sustained antiretroviral therapy and 95 % of all people receiving antiretroviral therapy to have viral suppression by 2025.

The North West Province is at ninety-three (93) percent of those who know their status. Seventy five (75) percent of the people who know their status are on treatment and patients who are virally suppressed stands at 84%.

As government we further commit to trace all HIV positive people and put them on treatment to make sure that they are virally oppressed. Hence it is important that we must work together to achieve the new 95-95-95 targets.

This will be done through the implementation of the *Phuthuma Project* strategy to reach the 95-95-95 targets. This includes community-based testing to increase case finding, tracking and tracing those who needs immediate care and treatment. One of the main priorities of government is to initiate and retain 119 408 people on Anti-Retroviral Treatment to reach these targets.

The provincial government took a decision to host the Provincial World Aids Day in Mahikeng Local Municipality. This is as a consequence of rising numbers in Gender-Based Violence as well as Women and Child Abuse cases in the Mahikeng Local Municipality.

The provincial crime statistics by the SAPS paints a grim picture on cases of Genderbased violence and femicide. In the first quarter of 2021/22 financial year rape increased by 10.9 % in the province with the total number of 769 reported cases. The Mmabatho Police Station made one of the top 30 Rape Hotspot list in the country recording 46 cases of rape. We need to work together to fight the scourge of gender-based violence and create safer communities for women and children.

Cases of Gender-Based Violence and Femicide continue to have reaching ramifications in our communities. I would like to urge men to stand and lead campaigns that are aimed at raising awareness about this pandemic. But critically to play an active role in exposing and reporting these cases to law enforcement authorities.

Together we can overcome this pandemic called Gender-based-violence and femicide.



Freedom Fighters in the North West Province has welcomed the resolution to formalize all the informal settlements in the Municipality on Monday, 5th December, 2022.

"The purpose of this motion was to ensure that the people of Lekwa Teemane, who live in informal Settlements, have their livelihoods developed by formalizing their areas and ensuring that they have access to basic services such as water, electricity and sanitation" the EFF said in a statement to MORONGWA.

"It is public knowledge that the ANC led government have for years neglected the poor masses of this country and focused their attention in satisfying the minority capitalist class of this country", the statement further said.

In its founding manifesto, 7 cardinal pillars and the 2021 LGE manifesto, the EFF has committed itself to being the only weapon left in the hands of the poor people of South

"We are delighted by the successful passing of this motion as the people of Extension 12 and 13 in Boitumelong and the people of Extension 4 in Geluksoord, are going to be formalized after staying in informal and unrecognized settlements for more than 7 years with government's full knowledge of their existence. The EFF wrote.

The success of this motion means that the people of Lekwa Teemane will through this process be able to get houses, roads and economic opportunities as they will not only have a place to call home but will equally have an opportunity to establish businesses in user friendly places.

PALAGANGWE-NGENGO IN COURT FOR FRAUD

AHIKENG - The former Mayor of Lekwa-Teemane Local Municipality, Kagiso Palagangwe, his wife, Meriam Fetsang Mokoka, as well as the former Municipal Manager, Ndoda Mgengo, are facing charges relating to fraud allegedly committed in 2015. According to court reports, it is alleged that during the period of 15 January 2015 to 11 February 2015, Palagangwe and Mgengo, who were serving in the office of the

Municipality, concluded a sale agreement for a property in Pretorius Street in Christiana with Palagangwe's wife, Meriam Fetsang Mokoka. *MORONGWA* has seen court papers in which Palagangwe, and Mgengo, alleged that the Council took a resolution to sell the property in question. A payment of R21,888.00 was made on October 15, 2015, subsequent to the sale of the agreement. Section 112(1) of Municipal Finance Management Act 56 of 2003 makes provision for a Supply Chain

Management policy in which a municipal entity must be fair, equitable, transparent, competitive, and cost-effective and comply with the prescribed regulatory framework for municipal supply chain management. Section 117 of the Municipal Finance Management Act 56 of 2003 provides that no Councillor of any municipality may be a member of a municipal bid committee or any other committee evaluating or approving tenders, quotations, contracts, or other bids, or attend any such meeting

as an observer. In reference to these Municipal Acts, the state concluded that Palagangwe, Mgengo, and Mokoka were guilty of fraud. The court further states that the three accused acted with a common purpose to unlawfully defraud the municipality by pretending that the Lekwa-Teemane Municipality Council had made a resolution to sell the property. They briefly appeared in Court and the case was postponed to 03 February 2023

INSTILLING DISCIPLINE THROUGH KARATE



PELEGENG - Many consider it a simple sports code while others say it is a foreign sport.

However, for a group of students from Mamusa Karate Club in Ipelegeng, it is much more profound than that.

Mamusa Karate Club was established in September 2022 by a highly graded black belt holder Kabelo Seetelo, with the motive of instilling discipline and passing the techniques of self defence to the students. Some of the club's students have already graduated from the entry-level white belt to a variety of belts, including orange, blue, yellow, green and purple.

This was done at a ranking ceremony held at the Ipelegeng Multi-Purpose Center on November 26, 2022, after they had undergone several combat techniques.

The founder of Mamusa Karate Club, Kabelo Seetelo, began karate in 1997 when

he was in his twenties, and along the way he earned several grades, including three black belts. Asked about the goal of the karate club, Seetelo told *MORONGWA* that it isall about discipline and being able to defend yourself when you are cornered into violent situations.

"With so many incidents of GBV in the country, women are becoming increasingly vulnerable. We thus teach them, without excluding men, techniques of self-defence.

We also teach them to always be disciplined at all times."

"We also want to keep young people off the streets, alcohol and drugs, so we always welcome new recruits. Young boys and girls, men and women who are ablebodied and not severely physically injured are welcome to join the club. We train from Monday to Thursday between 5pm and 7pm at the Multi-Purpose Centre", said Seetelo.
